YOU HAVE A VOICE IN AIR POLLUTION CONTROL IN ARIZONA

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) has reached a preliminary determination and is proposing to issue a significant revision to Vulcan Materials Company and a renewal permit for Hanson Aggregates of Arizona, Inc. The proposed permits are subject to the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act, Arizona Revised Statute 49-426, and Administrative Code, Title 18, Chapter 2, Articles 3, 6, 7, and 8.

Air Quality Control Significant Revision Permit No. 48171 for Vulcan Materials Company will authorize the hot mix asphalt plant located at 5301 South Dysart Road, Avondale, Maricopa County, Arizona 85323 to use up to 15 percent recycled asphalt product (RAP) as a partial substitute for the aggregate and oils in the asphalt. The mailing address for the facility is 2526 E. University Dr., Phoenix, Arizona 85034. This revision will not result in an increase in emissions of any regulated air pollutants.

Air Quality Control Renewal Permit No. 47851 for Hanson Aggregates of Arizona, Inc. will authorize the continued operation of a rock and concrete production facility located at 5899 Wilkinson Drive in Prescott, Yavapai County, Arizona. The mailing address for the facility is 4127 E. Van Buren Street, Suite 205, Phoenix, Arizona 85008. The proposed Permit will limit the emissions of the following types of air contaminants: particulate matter and particulate matter of less than 10 microns.

You have an opportunity to submit written comments on the both permits and make oral comments on the Permit for Vulcan Materials Company at a Public Hearing. ADEQ will be holding a Public Hearing regarding the permit for Vulcan Materials Company on Wednesday, July 1, 2009, at 6:00 PM at the Avondale City Council Chambers, 11465 West Civic Center Drive, Avondale, AZ 85323. A Public Hearing has not been scheduled for the renewal permit for Hanson Aggregates of Arizona. You may submit written comments on the Permit for Hanson Aggregates of Arizona, and request that ADEQ hold a Public Hearing on the Permit. Written comments shall state the name and mailing address of the person, shall be signed by the person, their agent or attorney, and shall clearly set forth reasons why the Permit should or should not be issued. Grounds for comment are limited to whether the Permit meets the criteria for issuance spelled out in the state air pollution control laws or rules.

Materials related to both permits, including the applications, ADEQ's analyses and the draft permits are available for your review at ADEQ's office at 1110 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona. For the proposed permit for Vulcan Materials Company the documents can be viewed at the Avondale City Clerk's Office at 11465 Civic Center Drive in Avondale, AZ 85323. For the proposed permit for Hanson Aggregates of Arizona the documents can be viewed at the Prescott City Clerk's Office at 201 South Cortez in Prescott, AZ 86303. Persons wishing to submit written comments can do so at the Public Hearing for the Permit proposed for Vulcan Materials Company. If mailed, written comments must be received by July 1, 2009. ADEQ will consider all comments received in making final decisions on the proposed permits. Everyone commenting will receive notification of the final decisions. People who file comments on the permits will have the right to appeal the final decision as an appealable agency action to the Office of Administrative Hearing (OAH) pursuant to §41.1092.03, and the appeal must be filed within thirty (30)

days after the issuance of the final decision. The OAH may sustain, modify, or reverse the final decision.
